STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The Healthcare Specialist Education Trust (HSPET) is a registered charity (Number 292218) and is governed by a trust deed. The trust was established under a trust deed dated 25th June 1985 which was amended by deeds of variation dated 19th May 1994, 26th July 2006 and 29th January 2014.

Organisation

The charity is governed by its trust deed which specifies that there must be a minimum of fifteen and a maximum of twenty four trustees.

Trustees must be appointed for a term of three years or less by resolution of the Trustees passed at a Special Meeting and may stand for re-appointment for a further period of three years. In exceptional circumstances a trustee may be allowed to exceed the six year maximum where this is deemed to be in the best interest of the Trust.

The Board is required to meet at least two times a year and in practice meets four times a year.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Principal activity

The charity's principal activity is to advance education with particular reference to the study of developmental and therapeutic play, including psycho-social care, in hospital of children and their families.

Investment Powers and Restrictions

Investments are held for the long term generation of income. The charity will not knowingly invest in securities that do not accord with its principles.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The Board completed a risk assessment and action plan for the implementation of the new GDPR legislation. Significant work was undertaken to review and write new policies.

The website and email systems were upgraded with a SLL certificate to ensure personal data and communication by email are secure. All Trustees had a new email account allocated for HPSET business.

The data base with an historical and current list of those who hold the qualification has been reviewed. All had been sent a GDPR notification by email or post to the address we hold on the record for them. This data base will now have a regular review to ensure compliance.

Student indexation has been re-designed to meet GDPR standards.

The re-registration process was redesigned and is moving to an online annual process from January 2019 with a minimal increase in fees.

A Public Register has been introduced and is accessible for the HPSET website.

HPSET and the National Association of Play Staff (NAHPS) formally wrote to the Health & Care Professions Council seeking membership. Access has been closed for new professions by an Act of Parliament, we were advised to seek membership with the Professional Standards Authority (PSA).

Negotiation with The University of West London and a college continue for the development of a course in the North of England to replace Bolton College.

The work continues in the application for a Higher Apprenticeship Award for the profession, a Trailblazer meeting has been held and work is progressing well.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting for Charities' issued in March 2015 in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

Results for the year

Financially there was a deficit of £6,254 (2017: £2,043) in the net movement of funds for the year.

The main sources of income continued to be in indexation and re-registration fees.

Reserves Policy

The trustees aim to retain unrestricted reserves equivalent to at least twelve months of forecasted expenditure. As at 30th September 2018 unrestricted reserves amounted to approximately 44 months of expenditure (2017: 54 months), based upon expenditure incurred during the year.

PLANS FOR FUTURE

Complete the Higher Apprenticeship Award application for the start of the academic year and investigate the launching of a play assistant and degree entry apprenticeship.

The new code of conduct and professional standards will be launched in December 2018 along with the new online re-registration process.

Research application for the profession to PSA and undertake a risk, cost and benefits review and present to the board and NAHPS.

Develop an action plan for the collection of data and changes that will have to be made to meet the standards for an application to the PSA in the seven key sections, taking any actions as agreed by the board.

Write and publish a National Strategy for Play services with the NHS Improvement Institute.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE TRUSTEES
